The Colega manual includes lessons on Equality, Discrimination, Bullying, Marriage and Family, Religion or Belief, Education, and Duty to the Community, among others. Colega materials have been developed to help you educate young people in your community on its principles. This manual is provided at no cost by the Geneva Office for Human Rights Education. Colega lessons help teachers, administrators and students learn about their rights and responsibilities. Lessons include songs, stories, activities, questions, discussion and challenges.
